It has been wonderful to see our students so excited and engaged in their learning in all areas of the school this past week.

Year 2's have had an incursion with a visit from "Reptile Encounters"; an organization that captivates students as they learn about the weird and wonderful characteristics of Australian reptiles. They saw, and some even held, an Olive Python named 'Tiny', Charlie the Salt Water Crocodile and Jasmine the Sugar Gilder Possum.



Other very engaging learning opportunities have included Year 3's singing "Stand By Me", as part of their Music lesson, various outside activities in Physical Education classes and the large Year 10 Robotics Engineering class trialling their "creations" in the downstairs corridor of the Middle school building. One of the Robotics students then left his group to participate in an on-line 'Nanotechnology' class; a subject he is enrolled in through the John Monash Science School.

I often reflect and consider how fortunate our students are to have these opportunities available to them. They are opportunities that will help facilitate problem-solving and critical thinking skills, teamwork and leadership development and other skills that will be important, no matter what career they pursue in the future.

Head of Middle School, Ms Janis Coffey, mentioned the significance of this during her presentation at the Middle School Information Night last week. She also explained our increased focus on thinking and problem-solving in the Middle school curriculum, including the role of the Design Thinking program at Year 9.

During the Senior School Information Night, I stressed the importance of families reading the 2018 VCE Student Policy Handbook together. Students and parents/guardians should have a good understanding of the many policies and rules outlined and are to both sign the VCE Student Declaration letter that was distributed earlier this week. This signed letter, a requirement of the VCAA (Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority), is to be returned to the students' Homeroom teacher by 3.00pm on Friday 23 February.
