Technology - self regulation

If your child has a smart phone, tablet, laptop or all three it is likely that social media is a part of their daily routine. One of the challenges with social media sites and apps is that they are often designed to be highly distracting. The social nature of many apps that students use also make them very difficult to shut down or leave completely as it can lead to social anxiety. Have you heard of FOMO? This is the fear of missing out, or experiencing anxiety that an event or activity might be taking place elsewhere that one is not aware of or included in. This can be more acute if "everyone else" is using social media. Banning access or use is not necessarily the right answer and may in fact have a negative impact on your child's study habits. Selfregulation is key, as to is developing trust. High performing students are able to design a study timetable that allows for breaks and time out, relaxation and technology updates. Elevate Education research indicates that high performing students use a bit of will power and determination, as well as self-regulation software to limit or prevent access to social media while they are studying. I remind families of VCE students that the Student Declaration Letter is to be signed and returned as soon as possible. All students in Years 10 – 12 studying one or more VCE subjects are to return a signed form. As this is a VCAA (Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority) requirement, it is extremely important we receive this signed document **no later than 3.00pm on Monday 5 March.** Students have been reminded of the importance of this on numerous occasions so I urge Year 10-12 parents, as a matter of urgency, to follow this up straight away and ensure the form is returned to the appropriate Homeroom teacher.

The Student Declaration Letter confirms students have received, read and agreed to abide by the VCAA and Southern Cross Grammar rules outlined in the VCE Student Policy Handbook. One important policy is the Attendance Policy that states VCE students must attend a minimum of 80% of classes for each of their subjects per semester. I therefore also urge families to consider very carefully the impact of family holidays during term time as such absences can have a detrimental effect on students' results and their learning, with extended absences potentially influencing the outcome of a VCE unit.

Attendance is also compulsory for all examinations, internal and external, across the school. This includes the Trial Exams for all Year 12 subjects to be held in the third week of the September holiday break from Monday 1 October -Thursday 4 October. So it is also recommended family holidays are not arranged for this holiday break.

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Much of the research suggests that as parents, we tend to *speak for our children*. Whether it is due to our busy schedules or simply wanting to help them, we are actually limiting their processing of new words and expression by doing so. Ideally, we would allow for children to respond to questions, as well as encourage them to use a varied vocabulary to express their thoughts, ideas and opinions.

How can you help at home?



- When you ask your child a question, give them time to respond (we call that wait time).
- Delve deeper when asking questions about school, eg: *How was school today?* could be extended in to: *Oh! School was good so what was so good about it?*
- Seek meaning of the words your child uses, so they can explain their known vocabulary this will help them grow in confidence, eg: what do you mean by living things?
- Play verbal word games with your child while in the car, at home preparing dinner, or even at the dinner table, eg: what's a word that rhymes with table? or how many words can we think of that sound like fork?

Of course, we know that expanding vocabulary helps our young learners in so many ways, so why not give it a try?
