The average tuition fee increase on the 2017 rates is 2.95% which is below the annual Education sector inflation rate of 3.10%.

From 2018 the school will not charge an additional camp fee for camps at Year 3 to Year 8 nor the Year 9 Melbourne camp, these charges have been incorporated into the Composite Fee shown above. An additional fee will be invoiced for other camps, these charges will be advised to closer to the date of the respective camps.

The School continues to offer a range of payment options, including Direct Debit, Direct Transfer, Cash (at ANZ branches), Cheque and Credit Card. Details of these are shown on your Tuition Invoice Statement which will be emailed to all families in the coming weeks.
