Professional leave

I am grateful to have the opportunity to take professional leave in Week 1 of Term 3. During this time I will be delivering presentations at various European universities on a book I have recently co-authored. The book, titled "I'm the Principal": Principal learning, action, influence and identity (2018) https://shop.acer.edu.au/i-m-the-principal is an extended interview study of 50 principals across Australian schools and sets out to better understand what it takes to be an effective school Principal today.

Much has been written about educational leadership - and various standards and frameworks have endeavoured to capture what effective principals are expected to know, understand and be able to do. While the Australian Professional Standard for Principals has framed the study and the interview questions that were asked of principals, the project focused on real people and their experiences within this construct, to look at Principals in action across varying sectors, contexts and settings.

- plan ways to be successful next term (in class, in the school yard, at home).


Positive Education News

This year SCG has once again entered the Literacy Planet Word Mania Competition.



How to Play

Word Mania is an interactive online word building game. Players are given a board of 15 randomly generated letters, and have three minutes to create as many words as they can. Every valid word formed earns points. Longer and more

complex words score higher, and scores can be boosted by building valid words consecutively, and using special Gold and Diamond letter tiles. Word building uses various literacy skills: phonemes, morphemes including affixes and plurals, spelling, word recognition, vocabulary and word knowledge.

Students can play as many times as they like, and the sum of the highest 50 game scores by at least five students from the same grade will be our school's score for that year level.

Classroom teachers will give their students a unique password to get started, so you might use the holidays to:

- ♦ Download the App (it's free)
- ◆ Practice your word-building
- Remind your friends to join the competition
- ♦ Keep your iPad charged up.

Competition Round 1 runs from Monday, July 30 - Friday, August 3. Let's hope you can help everyone at SCG become "Word Maniacs".
