### Student Progress Interviews

In recent weeks, a team comprising of teachers from across the sections of the School have met to discuss how we can best give feedback to parents during Student Progress Interviews.

After much discussion and review of best practice in schools, we will be hosting Student Progress Interviews this term on Tuesday 7 August and Thursday 9 August 2018 running from 3:30pm – 8:00pm and 9:30am – 8:00pm respectively.

Students will still be required to attend the Student Progress Interviews with parents in their full School uniform. This means that on Thursday 9 August, SCG students from F – 11 will not be required to attend classes during the day and will be required to attend the interviews only. Year 12 VCE classes will continue to run on this day.

We hope that this initiative will enable parents to see all teachers as required and that teachers as well will be able to give adequate feedback in a less time-pressured environment.

### For reflection – A resilient culture

On Monday 16 July the staff and I had the pleasure and privilege of listening to John Hendry. If you have not, then I very strongly suggest you do! The positive feedback from staff has been deafening, for his message is life-impacting.

It was an important opportunity to refocus and re-energise and John facilitated this using a very powerful manner. Please find below some excerpts for your consideration.

*A resilient culture is an inclusive culture, one that appreciates the fact that people do struggle with challenge and this struggle can limit motivation, engagement and application.*

*The resilient culture recognizes that "self-regard" is directly influenced by "social-regard", that other people matter. Social regard is the critical factor in how we regard ourselves and this social-regard is clearly posited in the "lived" culture, be it at home, at work, at school or at play. How others regard us determines directly our capacity to be resilient.*

*A resilient culture establishes an enabling and supportive social-regard context that does promote people being vulnerable and taking a risk, trying positively by addressing the challenge presented without the fear of being diminished, critically judged by others in a status sense for making an error or for not managing the challenge as well as one should or as well as one may have been expected to do so.*

*A resilient culture encourages one to be vulnerable, to “have a go”, to try something, to reach beyond “the safe”, to explore and to experience the unknown. A resilient culture promotes all to understand that exploration into the known unknowns is okay as is the more interesting and more vulnerable world of the known unknowns.*

*The resilient culture establishes hope and courage to present and to be actioned.*

*How cultures are structured in a resilience sense determines how we relate, how we live, how we grow and what is achieved and whether or not we have a sense of “common good”. Resilient cultures live moment-to-moment upon adding meaning to the lives of all. Resilient cultures are kind and promote the five elements critical to humane and constructive relationships that enable all to live meaningful and productive lives.*

*These five defining elements are trust, forgiveness, integrity, hope and compassion. The resilient cultures present these foundations. The resilient culture is the way forward.*

John’s message is one for individuals, partners, team members, families and organisations. As a school, we will not achieve our full potential without students, staff, and parents and carers committing to this collaborative culture.

We all need to incorporate trust, forgiveness, integrity, hope and compassion if we are to be at our strongest and best.

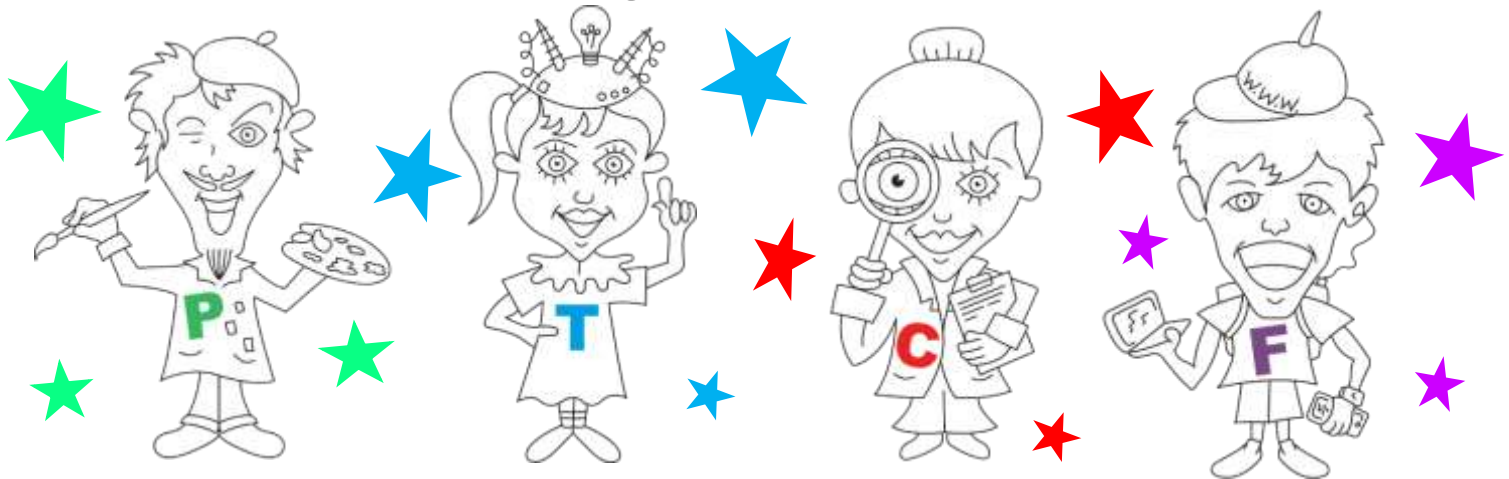
