It is an important time of the year for our students, especially those in the senior years. With Term 3 flying past at a rapid rate, VCE teachers are looking ahead, towards the final stages of their courses and the Term 4 exams.

All Year 7-12 students, particularly those studying VCE subjects, should be starting their preparations for the November exams. Any revision completed now will make life so much easier in the lead up to the exams.

Different students will approach revision in different ways, with strategies including completing past exam questions, preparing summary notes, learning definitions, 'teaching' concepts to other members of the family and studying in a small group in a local library for a change of scenery. Students have been encouraged to seek assistance from their teachers if they are unsure about how to approach their revision.

#### Unit 3/4 Trial Exams

Compulsory Trial Exams to be held in the VCE Centre, are scheduled for all Unit 3/4 subjects in the third week of the September holidays, from Monday 1 October – Thursday 4 October

The exam schedule is included in this newsletter and has been made available to all relevant students. These exams are an excellent practice run for the final November exams as students will have exposure to VCAA Supervisors as well as external markers.

Families would be aware that NAPLAN results have been mentioned in the media recently. It is our intention to pass these on to families when they arrive. We are not sure yet when this will happen but they will be packaged with the Term 3 Progress Reports if we receive them in time.
