#### Unit 3/4 Students and VCAA Exams

Yesterday was a milestone for the school as our first cohort of Year 12 students completed the first external VCE exam on site! An exciting time for the school.The students walked out of the 3-hour English exam at 12.15 pm relieved and smiling; quite happy with the questions on the paper. Let's hope their mood is reflected in their results.

These exams continue most days for the next 3 weeks so we wish our Year 12 students and Year 11 students completing a Unit 3/4 subject, all the best and hope they are able to navigate their way through this period with relative ease. Before long, it will all be behind them and they will be contemplating a lot more seriously how they will utilise



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the next phase of their lives. Families are reminded that when these exams are in progress, it will be necessary to be quiet when entering and exiting the school through the gate near the VCE Centre. Large clearly-labelled signs will provide details around this and extra staff will be on duty, particularly when there is a late exam (3.00 pm - 5.15 pm) that cuts across school dismissal time.

#### Year 10 - 11 Exams

The Year 11 exams commence on Thursday 8 November with classes concluding tomorrow afternoon whereas Year 10 students commence their exam period tomorrow with the Health exam in Period 4. Year 10 - 11 students have the option of studying at home or at school during exams as a supervised study room will be available. Wednesday 7 November is an exam preparation day for all Year 10 and 11 students.

#### Year 7 - 9 Exams

The Year 7 - 9 exams are in Week 7 from Wednesday 21 November to Friday 23 November and are compulsory for all students. Teachers will assist students with the preparation for exams during classes, but parents are also encouraged to provide support at home. This can be done in a number of ways, for example, by ensuring students have a quiet space to work, plenty of sleep, a healthy diet, regular meals, exercise and a homework and study routine.
