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2018 NAPLAN Results

Senior staff have spent time recently undertaking detailed analysis of our 2018 NAPLAN data. I thank Mrs Gallaway for much of this preparatory work.

I am pleased to advise that in all areas assessed across Years 3 - 9, SCG students performed as either above or significantly above the national standard.

Particular school strengths were identified in: Reading, Number and Algebra, Spelling, Statistics and Probability, as well as Grammar and Punctuation.

This information will be triangulated with other feedback to support our 2019 school improvement plan which we are in the midst of reviewing.

While there are many factors that contribute to student achievement, for the record here are Hattie's top 10 in order:

1.62 Teacher attributes (estimates of students), 1.57 Leadership, 1.33 Student prior knowledge, 1.29 Strategies emphasising feedback (intervention), 1.29 Strategies emphasising learning intentions, 0.92 Student beliefs and attitudes, 0.88 Teacher education, 0.86 Meta cognition / self-regulated learning (seeking help), 0.82 Scaffolding learning, 0.79 Student effort and practice.

You will notice that I have listed alongside each the impact measure.
