Embroidery arrangements for blazers

As mentioned previously, special arrangements are in place with Noone Imagewear for the progressive replacement of the SCG Blazer pocket over the next six months.

Year 3 students will, from 2019, wear a blazer featuring the new logo. Similarly, new students (Years 4 - 12, 2019) will also wear a blazer featuring the new logo.

Current students (Years 4 - 12, 2019) will have their pockets (and new and existing embroidery) progressively updated, at the School's expense, in the following manner:

- Those requiring embroidery for 2018 awards and Years 4, 5 and 6 2019 will be over the Christmas/New Year vacation.
 - Those requiring embroidery for 2019 Leadership positions and Year 7 and 8 2019 will be over the Term 1 holiday period (8 -18 April).
 - Years 9 and 10 2019 will be over the Term 2 holiday period (1-12 June). Year 11 and 12 2019, will be a voluntary activity, during the Term 2 holiday period (1-12 June).
1. Dry-clean the blazer and deliver it (in the plastic protective sleeve and with relevant instructions in the inside blazer pocket), to the Junior School Reception no later than Friday 7 December 2018 (final day of Term 4).
 2. If the blazer is not dry-cleaned, families will be charged the \$10.00 dry-cleaning fee.
 3. Any blazers not received by this time will need to be personally dropped off to Noone Imagewear in Niddrie and all costs incurred for embroidery and dry-cleaning will be the responsibility of the parent/carer. In addition to this, a \$25 single garment handling fee will apply.
 4. Blazers will be available for collection from Junior School Reception from 8.00am on the first day of the 2019 academic year—Thursday 31 January 2019.
