I trust our families enjoyed some quality time together over the past couple of weeks. It was lovely to welcome the students back on Tuesday and they all seemed so eager to learn as classes commenced. Let's hope the enthusiasm continues!

Our Year 12 students and the Year 11s studying a Year 12 subject are to be congratulated on the manner in which they approached their Unit 3 Trial Exams over the last three days of the holidays. Their attitude and commitment was commendable and should help ease the pressure when it comes to preparing for their final exams on Units 3 and 4 later this year.

As indicated in the letter emailed to Year 11 and 12 families last week, the 2020 Subject Application process has commenced. The first interviews were held this afternoon with some of the current Year 10 students and their parents/carers. Families of this cohort were contacted last week to arrange these interviews so planning for next year is well underway.

Interviews provide opportunity for three-way conversation, student reflection and for students, parents and teachers to work together to ensure our students are supported to achieve the best possible learning and personal development outcomes.

All students are encouraged to attend interviews with their parents. Students attending the interviews must be in full school uniform. Dismissal time for students on Monday 12 August is per the normal times, 3:05pm in the Middle and Senior School and 3:10pm in the Junior School.

Wednesday 14 August is a non-teaching day for F – Y11. All Unit 3/4 classes will continue as per the Daily Schedule on Wednesday 14 August.

Access to the booking site will be made available soon. For now, please put measures in place to be available to meet with your child's Semester 2 teachers and gain insight into your child's progress and achievement.
