- AMEB (or any equivalent examination) results and;
- any supporting documentation.

THE SELECTION PROCESS

- Audition: We require Music Scholarship Candidates to audition before our Selection Panel on-site in the week commencing Monday 4 March 2024. We will contact families beforehand with a date and time for their child's audition.
- Interview with the Principal: We invite candidates to an interview with our Principal, Mr Matt Dodd. The invitation is based on a candidate's audition performance, and evidence of a minimum standard of AMEB Grade 4 (or equivalent) in their chosen instrument (instrument dependent).

The Music Scholarship is awarded at the sole discretion of the Principal.
